

## Identifying Services in Scope of Third Party Verification (TPV)

NSW Government, the Commonwealth Government and national Disability Insurance Agency have released the "New South Wales Transitional Quality Assurance and Safeguards Working Arrangements" (June 2015).

The following information has been prepared by HDAA Australia Pty Ltd, an Approved Third Party Verifier, to assist service providers identify if TPV assessment and certification is required, and if so, which Standards may be used.

- <u>ADHC funded Specialist Disability Providers</u> with ADHC funding contract for 2015 2018 are required to undertake Third Party Verification (TPV). This rule applies whether a service is registering for NDIS or not, and also applies to ADHC funded Community Care Service Providers (CCSP).
  - Table A and Table B below show the specific services in scope for TPV if a service provider is currently ADHC funded. If an ADHC funded service is also registered for NDIS then the NDIS Support Cluster service types will also be included in the TPV.
- New Specialist Disability Service Providers who enrol with NDIS and are not funded by AHDC may require TPV. The NDIS Support Clusters (service types) have been split by NDIA into two groups based on risk.
  - New Specialist Disability Services offering Support Clusters deem a lower risk do not require TPV (Table A). New Specialist Disability Services offering Support Clusters shown in Table B, or offering supports listed in both Table A and Table B do require TPV.

Use the tables A and B below to identify if your service is required to undertake Third Party Verification (TPV).

Use table C to identify any other standards you have that may provide partial recognition to the TPV requirements.

### Choice of Standards for TPV

Services Providers in scope for TPV can choose the Standards for their TPV to fit with their organisation and other regulatory requirements. The Standards currently mapped as equivalent to achieve TPV are;

- the NSW Disability Service Standards (NSW DSS),
- the National Disability Services Standards (NDIS),
- or for service providers with sites or offices in Victoria or Queensland the following may be used, the Human Services Standards (**HSS**) in Victoria or the Human Services Quality Standards (**HSQS**) in Queensland;
- or if the service holds the Attendant Care Industry Standards (ACIS) or the Home Care Standards (HCS) these may be used for TPV.

In addition there are a number of other standards that have partial equivalence and have been mapped to the NSW DSS to reduce duplication. Service providers should advise HDAA of any existing certification or accreditation held to the following:
